OPEN FORUM

The considerable concern of the state of the road passing by Wardmoor, down towards Burrow Farm and up towards Freathingcott farm was raised again. The tractors continue to speed along these narrow roads and have destroyed the ancient banks with the wild flowers. The ditches have been filled up with the detritus left after the extremely heavy rains earlier in the year and will not function when the next heavy rain occurs. Councillors were concerned about this matter and have asked the Clerk to contact the Highways Officer and County Councillor.

- 6.5.1 PROW: Cllr Freeman reported that all the footpaths have now been walked and assessed. There will be a follow up meeting with the P3 Co-ordinator at DCC. Footpath 15 behind Whipcott Farm has been cut back for easier access.
- 6.5.2 Canal Report: Cllr Pilgrim will be attending the annual Canal Inspection on Wednesday 28th June. Cllrs may join this inspection as a guest.

Quarry Liaison Meeting: Cllr Lock attended the Quarry Liaison Group Meeting on Monday

15000 lorry movements this quarter.

Night working will be taking place for the next 2 months from the asphalt works. Shown plans of ponds and tree planting for when quarry closes in 2046. However, there will be a review of those plans in 2034 and they could possibly be amended at that point through the planning process.

40000 trees will be planted on a 2:1 basis. Discovery of bats have stopped any further extension of Westleigh quarry. There is about 20m of rock left to excavate here, which will take about 3 years.

Muckshift (top layer) removal finished on Fenacre and blasting is taking place, this quarry will be below road level at the end of its life.

6.7 Planning

6.7.1 Applications discussed:

6.7.1.1 22/00907/FULL Retention of disused quarry for use as two firing ranges at Devon & Cornwall Constabulary Pondground Quarry (further information) - Councillors agreed the following objection should be sent to MDDC

Holcombe Rogus Parish Council notes the recent Peregrine Survey submitted by the Applicant. While the Survey concludes that it is unlikely that there will be any disturbance to Peregrine nesting since none were observed in the quarry, it also noted that many other bird types are likely to be disturbed and displaced by the proposed firearms training. This appears to act against Planning policies that call for Developments to protect or enhance biodiversity at and around their sites.

Consequently, the Council's existing Objection to this Application stands.

Should permission be granted, our Council supports the recommendation that shooting should not start until after 1st August in 2023 to avoid disturbing nesting buzzards and suggests that there should be a Condition calling for the cessation of shooting during the nesting seasons in future years

6.7.2 Pondground Firing Range

District Councillors Gill Westcott and Jane Lock attended a meeting with Angharad Williams (Development Management Manager at MDDC) to discuss the Firing Range application. It is hoped that a new firing demonstration will take place in order that the new Councillors appointed in MDDC will have an opportunity to observe the noise prior to discussing the application. This would need to take place after the 1st August due to nesting birds. The decision on the application needs to take place by the end of August otherwise MDDC can be accused of non-determination and the Police can go straight to appeal. The last date it can be discussed is at the meeting on the 30th August unless a further extension is granted.

6.8 Mary Fewings Playpark

There is still £231 left in the playarea fund which can be used to purchase any capital items for the playpark. The option to have a basketball hoop is still being investigated.

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6.11.4 Several residents had raised the possibility of having CCTV at the three entry points to the village. Councillors discussed this and unanimously agreed that it was not a good idea for the village.

It would not cover the areas that the intruders appear to be taking (across fields). The village is a rural area and residents can put up their own cameras or attached to doorbells. There would be considerable practicalities to consider with GDPR being foremost and overseeing the footage.
